The programme has been developed rural development specialist Ian Dempsey, <u>Prescience Business & Management Development Ltd</u>, who will guide participants through an enlightening, informative and interactive, 7 module programme. It will explore development opportunities in areas such remote work strategies and hub development; digital transformation; climate change, renewable energy and emission reduction; environmental management, biodiversity and habitat protection; circular economy; digitisation of tourism and recreation; social and community development; resilience; health and wellbeing. The use of case studies and best practice examples will help develop participant's knowledge and understanding of themes and concepts such as the background and ethos of the Smart Village concept; community and project profiling; project planning and team building; stakeholder management; collaboration and network development; technologies and data; strategic planning and implementation; funding and communications. On completion of the programme participants will be equipped with practical ideas and actions and helped to identify the enabling policies and funding sources through which these can developed and resourced.
